The course also covers the fundamental knowledge of: the Spanish sound system (phonetics and phonology), the formation of words and sentence structures in Spanish (morphology and syntax), the study of meaning and functionalusage of Spanish (semantics and pragmatics). Other topics covered include the history of the Spanish language, linguistic variation in Spanish, and Spanish in the United States.
