


This Association shall have as its purposes:





the Immediate Past-President. They shall be known collectively as the Executive Committee. The President and the President-Elect shall serve a one-year term, and the Secretary shall serve a two-year term. These officers shall be elected by the voting representatives of the Association's member bodies. The President and the President-Elect may not be the voting representative from their respective institutions. Except under exceptional circumstances, the Presidency shall not be held by a member university more frequently than once in four years.

The President of Tennessee University Faculty Senates shall:


- 1) Preside over general meetings of Tennessee University Faculty Senates and meetings of the Association's Executive Committee
- 2) Provide an agenda for all meetings to the membership
- 3) Report at general meetings on all business transacted by the Executive Committee



Article VII: Meetings

Two general meetings of the Association shall be held annually, during the Fall and Spring academic semesters. Two meetings, one in Summer and one in Winter, shall be held with remote attendance. The date of the next general meeting shall be fixed at the meeting immediately preceding it. The virtual meetings will be coordinated by the President. Additional meetings may be called with the approval of a majority of the entire cohort of voting representatives.
