

NSF Public Access Requirement and Project Reports

The National Science Foundation (NSF) now requires investigators who receive an award based on a proposal submitted/due on or after January 25, 2016, to comply with the Public Access requirement to deposit published journal articles and juried conference papers in the NSF Public Access Repository. The **Project Outcomes Report** (POR) is a separate requirement for all awards, or funding increments, or supplements, made on or after January 4, 2010. POR must be submitted at the completion of the project by the PI directly through Research.gov (not FastLane) and should consist of a brief summary, prepared specifically for the public (which can include Congress and its staff) on outcomes of the funded project. The report should be written in an accessible language and make a clear argument as to why the findings of the research are of interest to American taxpayers.
