SGA Committee Meeting

Academic Affairs Committee: Senator Pickle – Discussed upcoming bill and looked into the University's current refund policies. The committee is planning to reach out to Matt Smith and discuss this further.

Environmental and Sustainability Committee: Secretary of External Affairs, Sorenson – The committee workshopped various bills through the committee.

SOLO Committee: Senator Roth - Discussed various plans for the Organization Workshop coming up; important topics to discuss, information to guide them, and other details such as lunch options.

Student Affairs Committee: Senator Wharton - After evaluating the current informal questionnaire that was given during tabling the week prior, the members of the Student Affairs Committee plan to explore or implement new bill ideas to present to the Senate. Sen. Marrero and Sen. Wharton are planning to propose a bill to establish a bereavement policy for students. Sen. Hall and Sen. Young plan to propose a resolution for Tennessee Tech to invest their efforts into improving street runoff during inclement weather. Sen. Ask and Sen. Abdu plan to propose a resolution or bill to expand current shuttle services provided from UCHRA for more bus routes and/or more shuttles available for students. Sen. Henderson plans to introduce a bill to expand the operating hours of the Caf. Sen. Ask and Sen. Wharton may also plan to introduce a bill to install a 24-hour general convenience or grocery store available to students on-campus. Other topics of interest brought up by the Student Affairs Committee include standardizing the base pay for GAs across the university, increasing the timeliness of maintenance orders being addressed, and installing more streetlights across Tech campus for better lighting.
